FOUNDING OF HAWAII'S ENGINEER'S WEEK AND HAWAII COUNCIL OF ENGINEERING SOCIETIES

The National Society of Professional Engineers (NSPE) initiated Engineer's Week (eWeek) in 1951 to highlight the important role engineers play in our society. The week was chosen to coincide with the birthday of our first President George Washington, who was a surveyor and staunch supporter of engineering.

As the Keynote speaker at the 2023 Engineer's Week Banquet on February 26, I talked about Hawaii's first Engineer's Week events in 1958 and the founding of the Hawaii Council of Engineering Societies (HCES) in 1964. I presented what I had discovered digging through the weekly meeting Bulletins from the Engineering Association of Hawaii (EAH) and Honolulu Newspapers in the 1950's and 60's and web searches. There is no more digging through seemingly endless reels of microfilm and scanning through thousands of articles. With today's search algorithms and pdf documents, it is more like surfing the Web.

So what did I dig up?

1958 – "Engineering in the International Geophysical Year"

NSPE adopted the International Geophysical Year (IGY) as their theme in 1958. IGY was a Worldwide program of geophysical research that was conducted from July 1957 to December 1958. IGY was directed toward a systematic study of the Earth and its planetary environment.

The first reference to Hawaii's eWeek was in a 1958 Hawaii Star Bulletin (HSB) article. I had been expecting to find that the Hawaii Society of Professional Engineers (HSPE) had initiated Hawaii's first eWeek events. But in the HSB article, I found that the Engineering Association of Hawaii (EAH) was reported to be sponsoring Hawaii's first eWeek. J. Robert (Bob) Britton, a superintendent with Hawaiian Electric and EAH 2nd Vice President had taken the initiative to form a committee to organize the Engineer's Week activities and had served as the committee chair. However, I found that Bob Britton was also President of HSPE, but in 1958 HSPE was waiting to be chartered by the national organization of NSPE.

In a January 1958 EAH Bulletin, **Bob Britton** asked other EAH members, who were also members of NSPE, for help in organizing the week's events. Bob also asked the other Hawaii engineering societies for their help. In EAH President Henry Burgress's 1958 closing report to the members, he confirmed "National Engineer's Week was observed for the first time



by the local engineering societies...and it had been a marked success due to the sterling efforts of committeemen from ASCE, ACE, IRE, ASME, AFCEA and EAH". His report included the committee members who volunteer their time. They were EAH – Dan Albertson, Donald Ho, George Becker, Wakefield Ward; ASCE Sam Hirota*, Dick Cox*, Owen Miyamoto*; ACS Ernie Thomas*, IRE (Radio Engineers) Ira Mercer, Warren Clark, Gorden Stagner; ASME Robert Walden, Robert Freitas, Manny Swerdlin; SAME James B. Wilson, Capt.

Maurice D. Roush, Cmdr. C. W. Capwell; AFCEA (Armed Forces Communication) Col. Wayne L. O'Hern. BTW Dick Cox is 102 and Owen Miyamoto is 95 and are both still with us (* eaH Members). I believe the committee Bob Britton formed was an adhoc committee made up of EAH and the other Hawaii engineering societies. Of 20 committee members 9 were EAH members.

In 1958 there were a dozen or more exhibits

On Friday, February 24th, AACE Hawaii held a webinar "Millennials in the Workplace" presented by Mr. Calvin D. Gidlof. During the presentation, Mr. Gidlof discussed the questions: who are they? What do they expect from the organization? How will they fit in the organization? What do we need to do to accommodate them successfully? etc.

On Friday, March 10th, it was the first time inperson Lunch & Learn event for AACE Hawaii Section since Covid-19. Sixteen members and friends assembled for lunch at the office of Rider Levett Bucknall to listen to a presentation on "where are we in economic recovery and where are we heading for" by Dr. Eugene Tian, chief economist at the Hawaii State Department of Business, Economic Development & Tourism (DBEDT). Dr. Tian and his department conducts research on economic issues such as tourism, emerging industries, diversification, quality of life, technology, energy, and taxation. His team also produces the official statewide shortrange economic forecast on a quarterly basis and the long-range population and economic forecast every 5 years. In his presentation, Dr. Tian reviewed that the COVID-19 pandemic hit Hawaii hard in April 2020. The unemployment rate reached a historical high of 22.4%, over 60% of firms closed for business, and visitor arrivals decreased by 99.4%, and presented their latest publications on the today Hawaii's economic performance after three years into the pandemic. In the end, he also discussed why we are heading for a recession in 2023.



downtown and proclamations by Governor Quinn and Mayor Neal Blaisdell. One of the exhibits was a model of the future Department of Transportation Building, which now stands at Punchbowl and Queens streets. However, I didn't find any reference to a banquet.

1959 - "Engineering ...for the Age of Space"

In 1959 **Sam O Hirota** moved from Vice Chair to the Chair position on the Committee. He was also a director on the EAH board that year. HSPE elected **Bob Britton** President, **Fay Fuhrmann** President Elect and **Fred Kohloss** Vice President. These three were also EAH Members.

Since I found no reference to a banquet in 1958, I believe the banquet / dance held at the Hawaiian Village Long House in 1959 was the first. The price was \$3.75 and dress was formal. Attendance was over 400. The HSB reported that 35 engineers would receive their professional engineering certificates at the banquet. I suggested we should return to this tradition of awarding PE licenses at next year's banquet!

Lindley R. Durkee, the Western Region Vice-President of NSPE was the keynote speaker at the banquet and he also presented HSPE their Charter. It turned out the HSPE's charter was the NSPE's 50th Charter just as Hawaii was about to become the 50th State in the US in August. Mr. Durkee had been the engineer in charge of the construction of Seattle's first floating bridge in 1939.

1960 – "Engineering's Great Challenge...the 1960's"

In 1960. James B. Wilson was Chair. Ken Sato Vice Chair, E.L. Ralston was Publicity Chair, and Keith Wallace was Finance Chair. There was a 12-page special section saluting Hawaii's engineers in the Honolulu Advertiser Thirty-six engineers were handed (HA) their professional registration certificates at the banquet by Board Chairman W. C. Engebretson. All eleven engineering societies participated: EAH, ASCE, SAME, HSPE, ASAE, ASME, SSE, IRE, AIEE, AIE, and SNAME. The Banquet was at the Outrigger Reef Hotel. Dean O'Brien, Berkeley's College of Engineering Dean Emeritus, gave the keynote speech on jet engines and nuclear aircraft.

1961 – "Engineering...a Career of Opportunity"

In 1961 **Herbert Heinrich** with AIEE was the chair of the Engineer's Week planning committee. **Fred Kohloss** was president of HSPE. There was a 6-page special section in the Star Bulletin. **W. J. Holmes** announced the starting of a graduate program for Electrical Engineers at UH. Maui Pineapple Company reported they had completed the modernization of their Ginaca pineapple coring machines in their own shops an engineering feat considered impossible by many Islanders.

Admiral John H. Sides, Pacific Fleet Commander was the Keynote Speaker at the Sheraton Meeting House, cost had risen to \$6. Admiral Sides said "there is now and will be for the foreseeable future a shortage of engineers." I commented if Admiral Sides would have expected the shortage to last for over 60 years. The Discovery XIV Space Capsule was on display at Fort DeRussy for Engineers Week. The capsule had been launched from Vandenberg Air Force base in 1960 and after orbiting the Earth 17 times it was recovered as

it parachuted back to Earth by a USAF C-119 plane from Hickam Air Force Base.

1962 – "Economic Growth Through Professional Engineering"

Roy W. Ahrens with SNAME was the Engineers Week Committee chair. Others were George Moriguchi, Dr. Arthur N. L. Chiu, Fred Bolte, James R. Collier and Van O. Darrow.

The first Engineer of the Year award was presented to Herbert A. R. Austin. It noted the Mr. Austin had been elected as an Honorary Member of ASCE one of only 195 in the Nation. The late Fred Ohrt long time manager of the Board of Water Supply was the first from Hawaii to be so honored. Mr. Austin was awarded a slide rule in a display case. The Banquet was held at the Princess Kaiulani Hotel. The price remained at \$6. Lt. General Walter K. Wilson was the Keynote Speaker. He was the nation's Chief Engineer for the US Army and arrived in Honolulu on the day of the banquet from Washington DC. The HSB paper announced the first Mechanical Engineer class would graduate from UH in June. Listed were Raymond Len, James Murphy, Peter Lee, Dennis Chong and Jose Padilla.

1963 – "America's Engineers Build for the Future"

I found no reference to an eWeek committee chair and no Engineer of the Year was selected in 1963. There was an eWeek banquet as 42 new engineers did receive their professional engineering licenses at the banquet. There was a 6-page special section in the Honolulu Advertiser. The section reported that the Magic Island complex was well underway. There was at least one exhibit, a jet engine for a F-86 Sabre jet fighter was displayed at City Hall by the Air Force. Since there was an eWeek banquet, newspaper supplement and displays, suggests there was a committee or event committees. Why there was no Engineer of Year selected may have been because there were no nominations or no selection committee, or nominations submitted were not sufficiently experienced. Whatever the reason it will likely remain lost in the past.

1964 – "Creative Engineering –Design for Tomorrow"

On February 1st, the Honolulu Advertiser reported on the founding of the Hawaii Council of Engineering Societies by 13 engineering organizations. Howard Hole (ASME) was the HCES first Chair. Others on the committee were George S. Moriguchi, Arnold C. Ash, E. C. Baughman, Franklin Sunn, Paul G. Schamp, Goerge S. Jenkins, Melvin Miller, K. W. Larson, C. Dudley Pratt, Roger Parlee, and Donald S. Austin.

The first luncheon sponsored by our Military was held at the Fort Shafter Officers Club. There was a panel discussion on the "Role of the Engineer in Our Modern Society". Panelists were Rear Admiral James R. Davis director of the Pacific Division of the Bureau of Docks; James B. Wilson of Wilson & Associates; Reverend Claude Du Teil of St. Christopher's Episcopal Church in Kailua; and Raymond M. Alden Vice-President of Hawaiian Telephone Company. The eWeek banquet returned to the Hilton Hawaiian Village Long House. Franklin Y. K. Sunn was named Hawaii Engineer of the Year. Franklin Sunn was a civil, sanitary, and structural engineer and Fellow in ASCE. He was President and Manager of Sunn, Low, Tom, & Hara consulting engineering firm. I found that, Mr. Sunn was very active in over 30 different engineering, social and government organizations. The keynote speaker was **E. Richard Mertz** who was a visiting engineer at UH engineering. HA reported Prof. Mertz "roared into the dinner meeting on a red wagon propelled by hissing, smoking carbon dioxide fire extinguishers. The bearded professor told the estimated 500 guests some of his experiences in rocketry and his award-winning 10 half hour TV education series in 1960".

To conclude, I believe HCES was founded to provide a more fixed structure for organizing the Engineers Week activities and to provide a council to help coordinate and promote all activities of Hawaii's various engineering organizations throughout the year. This is something HCES has successfully done for the last 59 years. So next year in 2024, HCES will be celebrating its 60th anniversary since its founding.

The thirteen founding societies for HCES mentioned above were: American Congress on Surveying and Mapping, ACS; Society of Naval Architects and Marine Engineers, SNAME; National Association of Corrosion Engineers, NACE; Engineering Association of Hawaii, EAH; Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers, IEEE; American Society of Safety Engineers, ASSE; Hawaii Society of Professional Engineers, HSPE; American Institute of Plant Engineers, AIPE; American Welding Society, AWS; American Society of Civil Engineers, ASCE; Society of Fire Protection Engineers. SFPE: American Society of Mechanical Engineers, ASME; and Society of American Military Engineers, SAME.

Based on what I uncovered, HCES should update the list of past HCES Chairs by adding Howard D. Hole as the first HCES Chair in 1964. In 1965 HSB reported that Howard Hole was the "general chairman" assisted by retired Army Col. William G. Van Allen, William Richardson Jr. Maj. H. R. Foster and George S. Moriguchi and that the above societies participated. I suspect this may be an error and William Van Allen was the 1965 Chair assisted by the 1964 past chair Howard Hole. In any case I'm sure both helped lead HCES and the Engineer's Week activities in 1965. Lastly, I suggest the earlier Engineers Week chairs from 1958 to 1962 before HCES was founded, J. Robert Britton, Sam O Hirota, James Wilson, Herbert Heinrich and Roy W. Ahrens, should be recognized as the first 'Engineer's Week Chairs'.


